COVID-19 posed a particular risk to patients with underlying issues such as heart disease, which is already the leading cause of death on the planet.





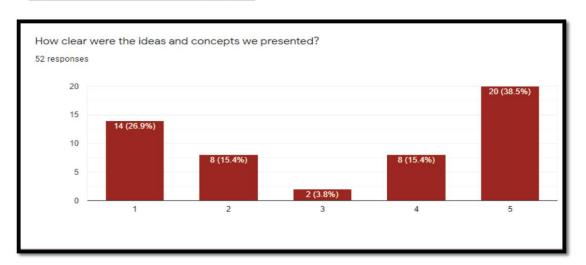

## Report

The multivariable analysis showed that monthly salary, occupational status, daily computer usage, history of previous eye problem, and knowledge on safety measures of **Computer Vision Syndrome** (CVS) and its adverse effect were found to be determinant factors for CVS.

The Webinar on Computer Vision Syndrome was organized at Kings College of Engineering through Google meet on 30.09.2021 at 11.00 am. The programme was started with the welcome address given by Mr.J.Radhakrishnan/AP-English. Our Secretary Dr. R. Rajendran inaugurated the Programme. The Principal Dr.J.Arputha Vijaya Selvi invigorated the organizers and student volunteers and our faculty members. The Programme was made by NSS programme officers Mr. P. Raajeshwaran, Unit I & Mr. S. Ambalatharasu, Unit II.

Our Resource person Dr. Swetha Ravichandran, M.B.B.S., D.O., Medical Officer, Aravind Eye Hospital from Pondicherry, delivered about **Computer Vision Syndrome** (CVS) are highly paid computer users and less likely to develop CVS than their low-paid counterparts. This might be due to the fact that high-paid computer users may have greater opportunity to use antiglare and good computers that could reduce the development of CVS. Conversely, low-paid ones were suffering from this disease because they could not afford these facilities. High-paid computer users might have good awareness on computer ergonomics and can optimize safe duration of computer exposure.

This demonstrated that the prevalence of CVS was found to be higher in government institutions; Monthly salary, daily exposure time, and knowledge were the most determinant factors for CVS. Hence, optimizing the exposure time and improving the awareness of users by rigorous training and management support are important to tackle the problem in the future. Finally the vote of thanks was delivered by our NSS programme officer Mr. S. Ambalatharasu, Unit II.

A heating world is seeing mosquitos spread diseases farther and faster than ever before. Extreme weather events, land degradation and water scarcity are displacing people and affecting their health. Pollution and plastics are found at the bottom of our deepest oceans, the highest mountains, and have made their way into our food chain. Systems that produce highly processed, unhealthy foods and beverages are driving a wave of obesity, increasing cancer and heart disease while generating a third of global greenhouse gas emissions.

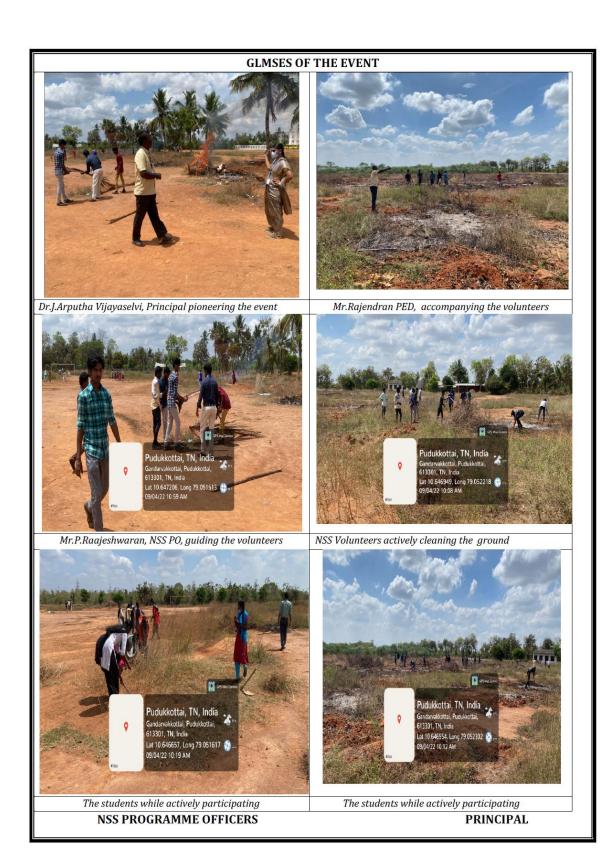
#### **Outcome**

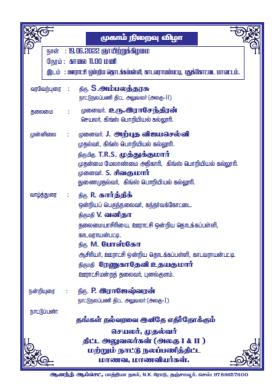

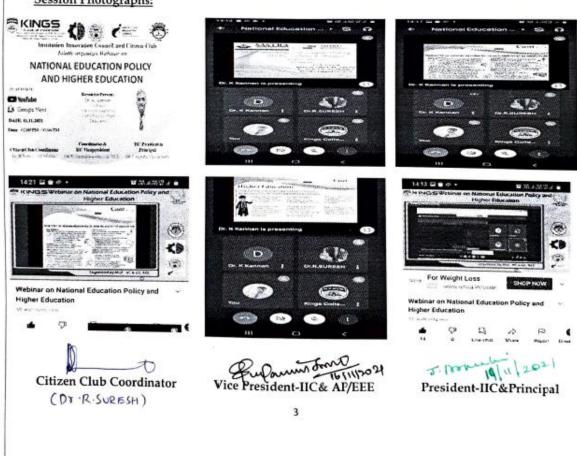

Education means a change in one's conduct of life. It means the upgrading of one's ability to choose best alternative available in any circumstances.

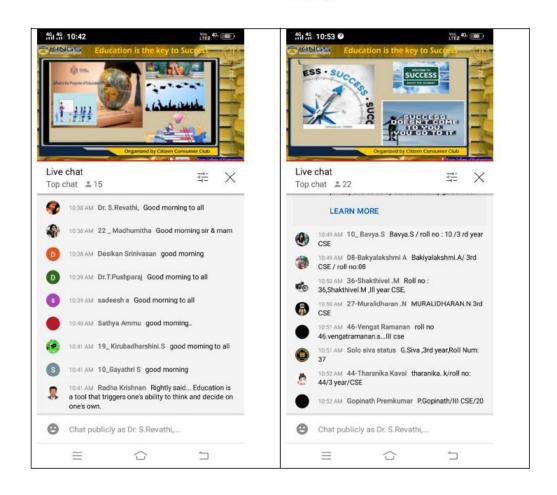
He pointed out education is inevitable in producing new generation that enable in solving the real problems in our society.

#### **Adulteration**

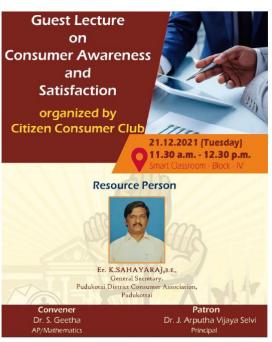

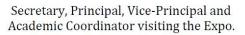

# **REPORT ON IMPORTANCE OF GIRLS EDUCATION - 11.10.2021**

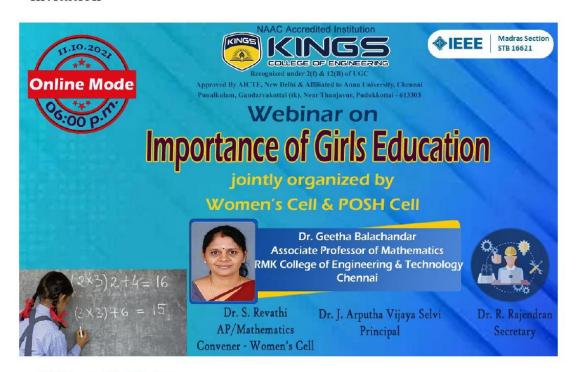

She had explained that educating girls saves lives and builds stronger families, communities and economics. She illustrated the importance of good academic performance and explained self learning –Tools for students.

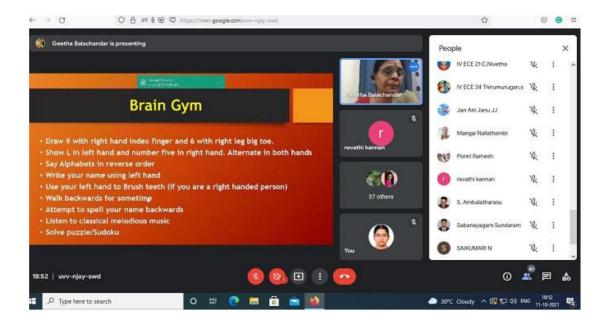

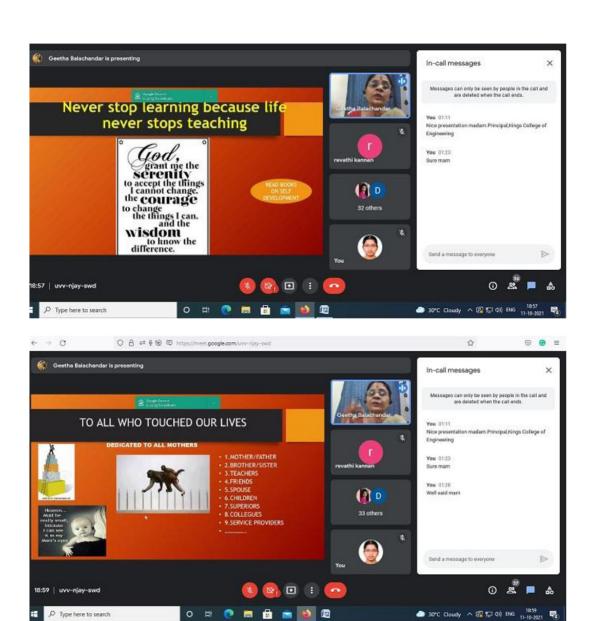

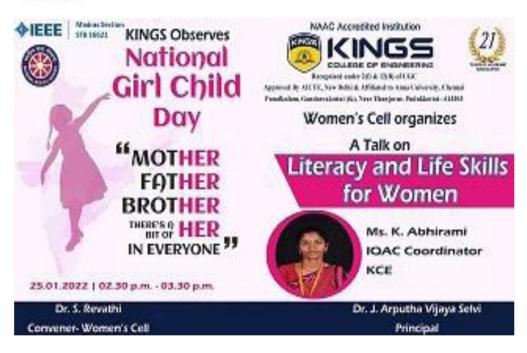
#### Strong Women

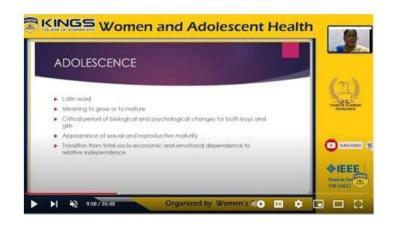
Sexually transmitted infections, of which human papillomavirus infection is the most common, disproportionately affect women and adolescent girls.

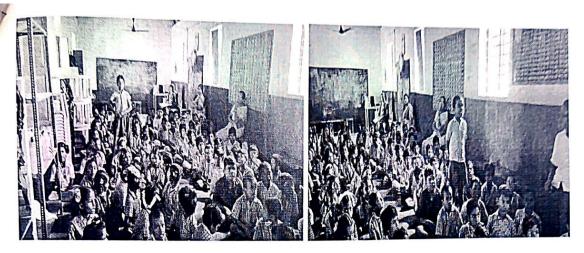
