



Report

Aim:

Corneal blindness is high and the rate of eye donation is low. Aiming to encourage the public willingness to donate eyes at various clinics, KCE set out to chain the people into a single fold of Donating Eyes to reach out the needs.

As per the direction of Ministry of Youths Affairs and Sports in the scheme of Swach Pakhwada under Swachh Bharat Mission, an Awareness Rally on 'EYE DONATION' was organized by the National Service Scheme Units of our college in Thanjavur at 10:30 a.m on 6.09.2022. The programme officers Mr. P. Raajeshwaran, Unit I and Mr. S. Ambalatharasu, Unit II, had made arrangements for the programme.

Insisting on the theme, a procession, held between Thanjavur Old Busstand to Dr. Agarwal Eye Hospital, was flagged off by Dr. R. Rajendran, Secretary, and Dr. J. Arputha Vijayaselvi, Principal, Kings College of Engineering had delivered a short speech advocating the need of donating Eyes. The NSS Units associated with Dr. Agarwals Eye Hospital Thanjavur to promote the noble ideology of depleting the visual impairment rate. The Rally was organized through volunteers from Kings College of Engineering and few Public members. The rally witnessed more than 220 students. Dr. J. Arputha Vijayaselvi, Principal, said that 'vision is the ability to perceive the surrounding world using light in the visible spectrum reflected by the objects in the environment and any diminishment of function results in visual impairment or blindness ranging from partial to complete with varying visual acuity.'

FEEDBACK:

The term "Eye Donation" is commonly used; there is no whole eye transplantation. Usually, only corneal tissue is donated. One person's cornea donation can restore the sight upto 4 people. Corneal or eye donation is one of the 'universal' donations where donors are not restricted by blood type, age, eye colour, and eyesight.



"AAPDA MITRA TRAINING PROGRAMME"

Report

Aapda Mitra is a centrally-sponsored scheme by the National Disaster Management Authority (NDMA) aiming to impart training to community volunteers in disaster response in the most affected districts identified across the country on the basis of past disasters. It aims to provide the community volunteers with the skills that they would need to respond to their community's immediate needs in the aftermath of a disaster thereby enabling them to undertake basic relief and rescue tasks during emergency situations.

Two NSS volunteers (Ms.J.Lavanya and Ms.M.Rubika) of our college, attended the "AAPDA MITRA TRAINING OF COMMUNITY VOLUNTEERS IN DISASTER RESPONSE" under up-scaling of Aapda Mitra Scheme sponsored by Government of India conducted from 10.09.22 to 21.09.22 at Tamil Nadu Disaster Risk Reduction Agency, Government of Tamil Nadu with National Disaster Management Authority (NDMA), Government of India. 

Every year, National Deworming Day (NDD) are observed on February 10 and August 10. In government, government-aided, Anganwadi, private, and other educational institutions, children and adolescents receive one dose of the safe medication albendazole. An evidence-based, widely accepted, and efficient method for reducing worm infections in all children is albendazole deworming.

NDD is a crucial **Anemia Mukt Bharat intervention**. The Ministry of Women and Child Development and the Ministry of Human Resource Development work together to carry out the program. In line with the initiatives, National Deworming Day was observed by National Service Scheme of our college on **February 14**, **2023**, **from 10 am to 12 pm**. As part of the programme, **albendazole tablets** were distributed to all the students to reduce the problems related to worm infestation. **534 students** consumed the deworm tablets. CAMP STRENGTH







Finally students expressed their queries about consumer protection act and the process of registering complaints against false and expired products.



Introduction:

The resource person pointed out clearly, food is basic necessity of life. Therefore it is essential that food we consume is wholesome and safe. Unsafe food can lead to a large number of food borne disease.

Food Safety:

Food safety means assurance that food is acceptable for human consumption according to its intended use. He explained the following physical hazards in food.

- Stones
- Hairs
- Stems and seeds
- Bone, fragments and feathers
- Jewellery
- · Nails, nuts and bolts
- Button

The following are invisible chemical hazards in food:

- Cleaning chemicals
- Adulterants
- Excess of permissible food additives
- Non-permissible food additives
- Veterinary residues
- Pesticides residues

The resource person explained about food infection and food intoxication. He insisted that without food security there is no food safety. Also he elaborated the biological hazards which are an important cause of foodborne disease.






Outcome






Gender Sensitization Cell Academic Year 2022-2023 Equity and Inclusion




Department of Science and Humanities Academic Year 2022-2023 Gender Sensitization Cell "Advancements in Women Safety and Rights"





M. Naveendra(I ECE B) who won the first place in the district level competition, participated in this competition and also she received the participation Certificate.


